Small Cap Growth

Q3 | 2018

MARKET REVIEW

Stocks climbed higher in the quarter, driven by solid U.S. economic growth and strong earnings gains boosted by recent corporate tax cuts. Large-cap equities generally outperformed their small-cap counterparts, with growth names broadly leading value peers across both segments. The Russell 2000® Growth Index rose 5.52%, with the largest sector returns coming from telecommunication services (+13.29%), information technology (+9.13%), and healthcare (+7.67%). Energy (-6.12) was the only sector that declined.

The U.S. economy's slow and steady expansion continued to offer a constructive backdrop for stocks. While trade tariffs were an overhang for some companies, overall fundamentals remained strong and earnings expectations quite high. Job growth was solid, wages were rising, and consumer confidence hit a new high, though housing and car purchases appeared to be stalling. However, we are also certainly closer to the end of this recovery cycle than the beginning, with growing late-stage signals, particularly in cyclicals. Inflation has also finally begun to emerge, especially in segments of the Producer Price Index, which is not necessarily a bad thing at current levels but does suggest that the Federal Reserve will continue on its path to normalizing rates.

PERFORMANCE

The Small Cap Growth Composite's return of 6.98% (gross)/6.72% (net) outperformed the 5.52% return of the Russell 2000 Growth Index. Industrials, materials, and information technology stock selection contributed to outperformance. An overweight information technology position and an underweight energy position were also additive. Healthcare and financials stock selection detracted the most from returns.

Paycom Software and Mercury Systems were among the strongest stock contributors.

- Online payroll and human resource technology provider Paycom Software climbed on higher-than-expected earnings and upbeat forward-looking guidance, as companies increasingly embraced cloud-based solutions to help streamline their HR functions. Shares also benefited as investors continued to favor both the recurring revenue streams offered by software-as-a-service distribution models, as well as U.S.-focused businesses with minimal trade tariff exposures.
- Defense contractor supplier Mercury Systems sharply rebounded from last quarter's disappointing performance on strong earnings and revenue gains. The company also announced the acquisition of Germane Systems, a manufacturer of rugged servers, computers, and storage systems for command, control, and information applications, which should help expand organic top-line growth.

Littelfuse and Supernus Pharmaceuticals were among the largest stock detractors.

- Fuse and circuit protection device manufacturer Littelfuse lagged despite stronger-than-expected earnings. Shares were pressured by general segment weakness from a slowdown in auto sales and industrial markets. We continue to monitor the stock after trimming exposure in the quarter.
- Drug maker Supernus Pharmaceuticals fell after posting solid earnings but disappointing revenue. The company’s key migraine drug is also facing new competition from a different class of drugs. We do not believe this competition will end up changing peoples’ prescriptions and maintained the position based on its consistent track record and attractive fundamentals.

PORTFOLIO CHANGES

We initiated a position in Roku and exited Beacon Roofing Supply.

- We bought streaming-video company Roku, which consists of two businesses: Roku digital media players that allow over-the-top streaming to televisions, and Roku Channel, an ad-supported free channel offering content, which continues to expand its reach. Both segments have performed well and continue to benefit as more consumers switch from cable to over-the-top viewership.
- We sold Beacon Roofing Supply, trimming the position after last quarter’s disappointing financial results, and then exiting it completely after the company again announced weaker-than-expected earnings. The firm has suffered from a general deceleration in homebuilding and related supply companies, as well as integration challenges around its acquisition of Allied Building Products earlier in the year.

OUTLOOK

While we remain positive in our outlook for growth stocks, we also recognize there is a lot of optimism priced into current valuations, and it has become increasingly harder to surprise investors on the upside. The fundamentals of the economy and general stock market are broadly quite good, but trade tensions, higher production costs, rising bond yields, and slowing global growth are also elevating general market nervousness. Against this backdrop, we are paying even closer attention to risk exposure, constantly reevaluating and reconfirming our thesis for each stock and ensuring we have the right position size for current market dynamics.

- Silvant Capital Management LLC ("Silvant") is an SEC-registered investment adviser and is a wholly owned subsidiary of Virtus Partners, Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of Virtus Investment Partners, Inc. ("Virtus"). Registration of an investment adviser does not imply any level of skill or training. Silvant manages assets on behalf of institutional and retail separate accounts and mutual funds. Silvant became an affiliate of Virtus effective June 1, 2017, when Virtus acquired RidgeWorth Capital Management LLC and RidgeWorth Investments ("RidgeWorth"). Silvant was created March 31, 2008, when all of the investment decision-makers associated with the growth equity investment strategies of RidgeWorth became employees of Silvant. The staff and decision making process remained intact and independent within Silvant. For composite reporting purposes, the Firm is defined as all equity portfolios managed by Silvant. Composite performance results are linked to performance history generated at RidgeWorth.
- The Small Cap Growth Strategy composite includes fully discretionary separately managed investment accounts and registered and unregistered mutual funds managed in accordance with the small cap growth style, with the objective of investing in in stocks with a competitive advantage, strong profitability metrics, above average free cash flow, above average operating margins and positive price trends. Under normal circumstances, Small Cap Growth Portfolios will have at least 80% of their assets invested in common stocks and other U.S. traded equity securities of small cap companies. U.S. traded equity securities may include American Depository Receipts ("ADR's"). Silvant considers small cap companies to be companies with market capitalizations similar to those of companies in the Russell 2000 Growth Index. Silvant will seek out securities it believes have strong business fundamentals, such as revenue growth, improving cash flows, increasing margins and positive earnings trends. Prior to September 1, 2015, the gross of fee return for the mutual fund was calculated by adding back the fund's published total operating expense ratio to the net of fee mutual fund performance; we now use the gross of fee return of the underlying portfolio. - The registered and unregistered mutual funds were added to the composite effective April 1, 2008, immediately after the creation of Silvant Capital Management. Prior to that date the composite consisted of only separately managed accounts.
- The benchmark for the Small Cap Growth Strategy composite is the Russell 2000 Growth Index, which is composed of the securities found in the Russell 2000 Index with a greater-than-average growth orientation. Companies in this index tend to exhibit higher price-to-book and price-to-earnings ratios. The index is calculated on a total-return basis with dividends reinvested. Index returns do not reflect the deduction of any fees or expenses.
- The three-year annualized standard deviations for the composite and the benchmark index are calculated using monthly returns.
- Beginning March 31, 2008, composite policy required the temporary removal of any portfolio incurring a client initiated significant cash inflow or outflow of 10% or greater of portfolio assets. This policy was discontinued effective January 1, 2013.
- The dispersion of annual returns is measured by the equal-weighted standard deviation of portfolio returns represented within the composite for the full year. Partial year dispersion is measured by the equal-weighted standard deviation of portfolio returns represented in the composite for the partial year period specified. No dispersion is reported for periods with five or fewer portfolios (shown as N/A).
- Returns are calculated based on total return which (a) includes cash returns, realized and unrealized gains plus income; (b) utilizes trade date and accrual accounting; and (c) is after the deduction of actual trading fees and expenses. Portfolio returns are calculated utilizing daily valuation. Composite returns, calculated monthly, are the weighted average return of the underlying portfolios using beginning-of-period market values. Composite gross of fee returns do not reflect any deduction for investment advisory fees, custodial charges or other costs that a client might incur in connection with the management of an account. Composite net of fee performance is calculated assuming a fee of 1.00%, the highest fee for this type of investment account.
